Arrays




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Directions

- Assign a homework activity for your students to make a multiplication array at home using their favorite toys, snacks, or any other objects (with the multiplication equation written on the <u>back</u> of their array).
- Label each array with a letter (i.e. "A", "B", etc.) or with each child's name. Have children use these labels in their booklet to identify which array they are working on. Run off the title and the number of additional pages you will need for each child's booklet.
- Display these arrays around the room and have the children go around the classroom, drawing a representation and writing either the repeated addition or multiplication equations to solve their classmates' arrays in their booklets.







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
