

MASON'S MAGIC SHOW

Hundreds Chart Addition

After reading and discussing the children's book, "Mason the Magician: Hundreds Chart Addition," children may play this game with a partner to practice their addition skills using a hundreds chart.

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Preparing your materials ...

- ▼ either mount or run off hundreds charts on colored construction paper and laminate (each partner group will need three hundreds charts)
- ▼ run off card set ft on red construction paper; set B on blue construction paper; set C on yellow construction paper (laminate cards)

! Hint:

If you do not have colored counters, give children different colored cubes, beans, or squares of paper to use as counters.

▼ "counters" are not included (you will need 15 counters of two different colors per game)

Directions ...

- ▼ Partner ft begins by turning over a red and blue card and saying the total (Partner B should use their hundreds chart to check Partner ft's answer).
- ◆ Partner ft will then turn over a yellow card and add this number to the total of the red and blue card
 (Partner B should again double check).
- → Partner A will place their counter on the hundreds chart game board
- ▼ if the answer is already covered, you miss a turn
- ♥ play continues until one player has five counters in a row (vertically, horizontally, or diagonally)


