

SNOWBALL FIGHT

An Even and Odd Game

Children can have fun reviewing even and odd numbers with this fun learning activity that goes along with the book, Alien Even and Alien Odd.

How to Play

What would have happened if Alien Even and Alien Odd had landed where is was snowy? They would have had a snowball fight, of course!

Run off the number cards on regular ditto paper. Crumple the cards into "snowballs" and pass out to children. Stand back and watch the fun as children have a "snowball fight." At a given signal, have children stop, find the closet snowball to them, open their snowball and identify if their number is even or odd.

After playing, have fun with these even and odd cheers ...

O, 2, 4, 8 we're EVEN and that's just GREAT!

1, 3, 5, 7, 9 we're ODD and that's just FINE!

The class might want to enjoy a nice warm cup of cocoa with marshmallows (even and odd amounts, of course).
